COUNTY COUNSEL REPORT

4. County Counsel stated for the record that while this is an online meeting, it is a public meeting the same as if it were held in person in the Commission's hearing room and rules that allow for an orderly meeting shall apply. 7. Project No. 2023-004496-(2). Planner: Shawn Skeries. Applicant: Los Angeles County Department of Beaches and Harbors. 13650 Mindanao. Way Westside Planning Area. a. Coastal Development Permit No. RPPL2023006624. To authorize the construction of a parking facility consisting of an approximately 100,171-square-foot, two-story, three-tier parking structure, with approximately 304 parking spaces, and a surface parking lot with approximately 64 parking spaces, for a combined total of approximately 368 parking spaces, in the P (Parking) and PF (Public Facilities) land use designations. b. Conditional Use Permit No. RPPL2023006617. To authorize the use and operation of a parking facility in the PF land use designation. c. Environmental Plan No. RPPL2023006632. To consider an MND with impacts to air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, noise, and tribal cultural resources reduced to less than significant with mitigation measures pursuant to CEQA reporting requirements.
